We ask about conviction history to ensure that we collect information important to assessing the composition of our teaching and learning community. We invite you to disclose honestly and completely the relevant information about prior misdemeanor or felony convictions, and to describe in as much detail as you'd like the ways in which this experience has had an impact on your life.

Regardless of your conviction history, we urge you to complete your application. A prior conviction does NOT disqualify an applicant for consideration for admission to Princeton. In fact, information about an applicant's conviction history will not be available to the reader the first time an application is reviewed in our process. Covering this box will ensure that the initial reading of any applicant's file will not discriminate on the basis of their conviction history. When the file is read subsequently, the information will be shared, but will be considered in the context of the first, non-prejudicial review of the application.

Princeton believes knowing an applicant's prior conviction history is relevant as we invite students to participate in our campus community. We also believe that past mistakes often happen in contexts that deserve and require explanation and amplification. We strongly urge you to tell us your story and to explain how your experience has affected your life, as you complete and submit your application for admission to Princeton.
