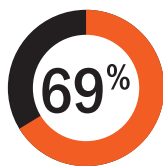

Our financial aid program is the best among any higher education institution. Research shows that many high-achieving, low-income students don't apply to selective colleges like Princeton because they think the cost is prohibitive. This isn't true.

*In fact, for students from low-income families, Princeton typically costs less than most state universities, community colleges, or smaller liberal arts schools.*

If you come from a background of modest financial means, you can expect your need to be met completely by Princeton's aid program. 89% percent of recent seniors graduated debt free.
